A MESSAGE FROM PASTOR KEITH ZEH...

"Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, so I send you." When Jesus had said this, he breathed on them and said to them, "Receive the Holy Spirit."

John 20:21-22

Ruach (pronounced roo-akh) is the Hebrew word for spirit, breath, or wind. This word, translated as "breathed" in John 20:22, is also found in Genesis 2:7: "Then the Lord God formed man from the dust of the ground and breathed into his nostrils the breath of life; and the man became a living being."

Jesus enters a locked room where his disciples are huddled in fear and uncertainty about the future and what to do. He brings them a peace that passes all understanding, animates them with the life-giving breath of God, and commissions them through the power of the Holy Spirit to continue Jesus' work and grow forward as a community for God's mission.

On Sunday, April 24, our five congregations will have an opportunity to catch their breath by catching God's breath in worship, followed by refreshments and conversation. We'll gather for one 8:30 a.m. worship service hosted by Immanuel in Bejou. Pastor Rebel Hurd, our Synod's Director for Evangelical Mission, will be our guest preacher. She will also facilitate an after-worship conversation. During this conversation we'll hear from one another about how things are going, what we have been learning along the way, and about our hopes for the future. This significant conversation will also help determine future direction for the continuing mission development of the New Journey Lutheran Parish.

When our bodies and souls can relax a bit, confident that our good planning and planting work is growing and in need of less-stressful tending from us.

We have made it through a hard Winter of pandemic, transition, and change, and now signs of Spring are here: baptisms, confirmations, weddings, first communions, new members, and sanctuaries steadily filling with our neighbors.
