A MESSAGE FROM PASTOR KEITH ZEH...

One man was there who had been ill for thirty-eight years. When Jesus saw him lying there and knew that he had been there a long time, he said to him, "Do you want to be made well?" The ill man answered him, "Sir, I have no one to put me into the pool when the water is stirred up, and while I am making my way someone else steps down ahead of me." Jesus said to him, "Stand up, take your mat and walk." At once the man was made well, and he took up his mat and began to walk.

John 5:2-9

Near the Temple in Jerusalem was a special pool of water called Beth-zatha that had healing properties. It was said that every now and then an angel would stir the water, the water would begin to bubble, and the first one in the water would be healed. There was a man who had been on his mat for thirty-eight years, waiting for such a miraculous occurrence. A long time to sit waiting, watching, and hoping, convinced that life will bubble up outside of him, over there, in that magic pool of water.

During all those years he was living an "as soon as" life. "As soon as the water bubbles, then I will get up off my mat. As soon as I get to the water, my life will be better. As soon as I get into the water, my problems will be fixed." The "As soon as" puts life on hold. The pause button has been pushed. One sits on their mat, self-imprisoned by the circumstances of their life. The imprisonment is so great that when Jesus asks the man, "Do you want to be made well?" the man doesn't even say, "YES!" Instead, he names his circumstances. "I have no one to put me in the water. When the water bubbles others get there first. They take cuts."

Now, I'm not suggesting that the circumstances of our lives are irrelevant or have no effect. They do affect us sometimes profoundly. That said, we are more than the circumstances of our lives. Life is not to be found outside our various situations or circumstances, but within them. Notice that Jesus does not help the man get into the water. He comes to him on his mat, the same mat and situation the man so wants to escape. Jesus comes alongside and speaks words of life and resurrection. "Stand up, take your mat and walk." It's worth noting that the man does not leave his mat behind. It goes with him. His circumstances are real. The difference is, he now carries them. They no longer carry him.

Jesus doesn't change our outer circumstances. Jesus changes us. He calls us into a new way of being, seeing, acting, speaking, and thinking. When we stand and rise to that new life, we discover the circumstances don't hold the same power over us. That doesn't necessarily make life easy or mean we no longer must deal with these circumstances of life. It means that we can now engage them, trusting (having

faith) in the power, promise and presence of our risen Lord Jesus. The life Jesus offers does not happen "as soon as" It happens in this place, at this time and in these circumstances which we find ourselves.

Dear Lord Jesus, you have come alongside us in the midst of our circumstances and situations we find ourselves, calling us to take up our mats and walk where you lead - to ventures of which we cannot see the ending, by paths as yet untrodden, through perils unknown. Give us faith to go out with good courage, not knowing where we go, but only that your hand is leading us and your love supporting us, through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

A MESSAGE FROM KATIE DEMARAIS, SAM

"So that the genuineness of your faith—being more precious than gold that, though perishable, is tested by fire—may be found to result in praise and glory and honor when Jesus Christ is revealed."

1 Peter 1:7

The word that has been rolling around in my brain lately is "Authenticity." I'm not talking about authentic translations of the Bible or certificates validating memorabilia. I'm talking about living an authentic life, especially when it comes to your faith.

I strive to do that in my daily life; how about you? I try to act the same way in the sanctuary on a Sunday morning that I do out in the community, yes, even on a Friday night. That doesn't mean that I 'act' at all. I am who I am, and if I strive to be anything at all, that is non-hypocritical. One of the worst criticisms that I have ever heard of Christians is that they act 'holier-than-thou' on a Sunday, while spending the rest of their week sinning. That is actually true, we do spend our entire week sinning. That is why we need the confession and forgiveness found in Worship, so that we can begin each week anew, washed clean in the blood of Jesus. I will be the first person to admit that I am 100% Sinner, and I believe as our Lutheran faith teaches, I am also 100% Saint. I know I cannot earn my own salvation, but only believe in the gift of the resurrection, and say 'sorry' when I do make mistakes and try again. That is the reality in which I live, I believe, and the message I hope my life and my actions share, both in the pulpit and out of it.

That is my wish for our ministry together, that it strives to be Authentic. One of the goals that we have set for our Parish, the first one actually, is called Worshipping Without Walls, and its focus is creating more worship and fellowship opportunities outside the walls of any of our congregations. We hope to bring the Word of God to folks who cannot or choose not to enter into a sanctuary. We worship in parks, by lakesides, parking lots, and in barrooms. We meet for fellowship at area convenience stores, cafes, school parks, and bar & grills. These are not 'traditional' worship spaces, but they are spaces in which folks traditionally reside.

Even when meeting in non-traditional spaces, we are sharing the same Gospel message, that God loves everyone hearing and believing in the Word proclaimed. We are just shouting that message a little wider, to reach ears sometimes out of the reach of the pulpit. We are admitting our sinner/saint reality, and offering the hope that can be found in God's forgiveness, death, and resurrection. That is authenticity. We are not changing the Good News for either audience; we are not trying to be edgy or disruptive or putting on any kind of act. We are being the Church, wherever we happen to be. We are following the example of Jesus and his ministry of meeting people where they are. We are still meeting in our sanctuaries for worship and renewal, to be filled with forgiveness, hope, and energy to get back to the work of ministry.

I hope that folks see our faith and God's love come shining through our authentic lives and our actions, and think, 'wow, I've got to see what faith in Jesus could mean for me.' That is my hope and my prayer.
