A New Journey Lutheran Parish Gary, Immanuel, Ness, Our Savior's, & Sundal Lutheran Churches

- The two old Parishes (Immanuel/Our Savior's and Gary/Rindal) will be dissolved as of October 31 and the new A New Journey Lutheran Parish (Gary, Immanuel, Ness & Our Savior's) will go into effect November 1. Pastor Keith Zeh will continue to be with us in some capacity until a new Pastor Mission Developer is hired.
- Along with Rachel Roggenbuck's primary focus of working with our Parish as Organist and Worship Life Coordinator, she has been selected to serve, alongside Bishop Bill, on the NWMN Synod FACES of Leadership. As part of that new role, she will also coordinate our Synod's ELCA Coaches. We congratulate her on this selection and wish her well in this additional role as she represents our Parish while working with the Synod.
- All are welcome and encouraged to come to Sundal on October 16 for worship followed by a time of food and fellowship. There will be special music and a time of celebration for Sundal's long and rich history.
- SUNDAY SCHOOL: Third grade Sunday School students from each congregation will receive Bibles during worship services on Sunday, October 30. If you have an older student who has not yet received their Bible, please contact Katie or Pastor Keith so those students can also receive Bibles that day.
- CONFIRMATION: Confirmation classes have started. Toward the end of this newsletter, see information about a November Youth Gathering in Alexandria.

A MESSAGE FROM PASTOR KEITH ZEH...

"So let us not grow weary in doing what is right, for we will reap at harvest time, if we do not give up. So then, whenever we have an opportunity, let us work for the good of all and especially for those of the family of faith." Galatians 6:9-10

It always seems that in the time between the then and the now, there is always a delay that requires patience. This can be an irritating reality for many people, myself included, when there is an expectation of instant fruition of plans made or outcomes from work that has been done.

Some of the most delicious vine-ripened tomatoes were served at the Our Savior's meatball dinner. The wait for the ripening needed to produce such scrumptious tomatoes was worth it. There's no comparison between a vine-ripened tomato, which was allowed to grow slowly, and a tomato that was picked prematurely. If you pick too soon, you miss the flavor.

Reaping is always in a different season than sowing. But while you're waiting, God is working. When you're waiting for the fulfillment of the efforts or money or energy that you've put into something, you may think nothing is happening. While that seed is hidden in the ground, it is slowly germinating. And when that seed bursts with God's blessing on it, it will continue growing and growing. One day a little shoot will stick up out of the ground, and then you will see that it's working. But until then, we need to trust that God is working — even when we can't see the fruit of our labor. Plants take time to grow. There's no such thing as instant maturity. No farmer goes out, plants the seed in the ground, comes back an hour later, digs it up, and expects it to have grown. You've just got to let it be. Leave it covered, and let God grow it in God's time.

In the book of Romans, Chapter 5 (from the Message by Dr. Eugene Peterson), the Apostle Paul writes that there's more to come! Then he points to "passionate patience" and how it provides an alert expectancy for a harvest to come. A harvesting where we won't be able to find enough containers to hold everything God generously pours into our lives through the Holy Spirit!

Dear Lord Jesus, may the seeds being planted for congregational and parish vitality continue to germinate and grow into a bountiful harvest. May the Holy Spirit develop a "passionate patience," keeping us alert for whatever God will do next. Amen!

A MESSAGE FROM KATIE DEMARAIS, SAM...

"I think it's fair to wonder if by joining others, we are losing a little sense of self." (The Practice)

This is not a Bible verse, but I heard this great line in a TV show the other day, and it struck me as familiar to a few of the comments that I read in our recent survey responses. (If you haven't gotten to read the survey responses, there are copies now at all the congregations, on our website, or I'd be happy to get you one if you ask. There are some great ideas shared in them.) First off, I want to thank you for being so honest and candid in those surveys. We cannot address conflicts if we do not first voice them. Secondly, I wonder if more folks in our congregations who have joined together in this New Journey feel this way. I know I have felt this way at times, in other situations of folks joining together, such as sports teams, friend groups, and even school districts. This feeling that while there are great benefits to joining more folks together to share resources, ideas, manpower, and more, but that there is a sense of loss of self. Even if it is only imagined, the feeling of it is still real to many of us. Maybe that is only human nature, and it's okay to feel this emotion. It's only natural to want to preserve a sense of self or that of the community you have worked so hard to create or preserve.

I want you to know as a representative of the staff that you have called to work for you and with you, that we as the new Parish are not trying to strip any one or any congregation of their sense of self, their history, or their personal values or beliefs. Quite the contrary. As we join together in the new Parish, we want to lift up, value, and cultivate everyone's individual gifts and talents, identities, and congregational strengths. We have written so in our shared Capacity Plan, written by our shared Practicing Resurrection team (also available in congregations, online, or by request): "God has already provided all we need to do what God needs us to do." Our objective in this resurrection process is rediscovering the hope that we have in Christ. We know that every person has something to offer and gifts to share, because we are all Children of God. Through this revitalization process, we are going to be purposefully recognizing and naming the gifts and talents of those in our midst, empowering people to use those gifts for good, and utilizing those gifts to spread the love of God and create positive change in our communities.

As we move forward into this New Journey, I ask you to help us hold fast to this plan and to stay true to our individual and congregational sense of selves. To recognize and name in others their gifts, to empower them to use those gifts for God's Mission, and to call out times if and when it feels as if we are in danger of losing our sense of self, individually or congregationally. We need ALL of the different voices, gifts, talents, and ways of doing ministry that are present in our Parish to make this the most effective ministry we can. Let us be individually united in God's Mission.

Summary of September 21, 2022, Immanuel Council Meeting Minutes

Council members present: Duane Gunderson, Peggy Gunderson, Gloria Steinbrenner, Delane Schaumburg, Cindy Large, and Jon Large. Others in attendance: Pastor Keith Zeh, Katie DeMarais and Rachel Roggenbuck.

Treasurer's report was provided.

Katie reported on Confirmation, the need for mentors for each confirmand, and the Synod's Middle School event scheduled in Alexandria in November.

Old business included:

- Status of projects were reviewed as follows: sidewalks completed, parking lot paving completed, water softener replaced, church siding cleaned, and the curbing & rocks around church are complete.
- We received pricing on lutefisk but will make the final decision at the October council meeting on whether or not to go ahead depending on an adequate number of people to work at preparing and serving the meal.

New business included:

- Due to the 16% increase in our 2023 church insurance premium, it was decided to get quotes from a couple other insurance companies.
- For liability purposes, background checks will be conducted on all Parish employees; and during Sunday School and Confirmation classes, classroom doors must have windows in them or be kept open.
- The Call Committee will hold its first interview by a Zoom meeting on September 22 at Immanuel.
