A MESSAGE FROM PASTOR KEITH ZEH...

Therefore, since we are surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses, let us also lay aside every weight and the sin that clings so closely, and let us run with perseverance the race that is set before us, looking to Jesus, the pioneer and perfecter of faith. (Hebrews 12:1-2)

As A New Journey Lutheran Parish, we are off and running together the race our Lord Jesus has set before us. "They all finished the race at the same time. And when they did, everyone in the stadium stood up and clapped and whistled and cheered for a long time. And you know why? Because deep down we know that what matters in life is more than winning for ourselves. What really matters is helping others to win, too, even if it means slowing down and changing course now and then."

Let's link our arms, leaving no one behind, and run this race together. Even if it means slowing down to make sure we're letting God have God's way with us and changing course now and then as the Holy Spirit guides us in following our Lord Jesus.

Thank You, Lord Jesus, for enduring the cross. Thank You for finishing the race for us. Help us to follow the path you laid out for us as we look to You. May we walk hand in hand with You, relishing the journey because we have sweet fellowship with You, understanding that it doesn't depend on us, but on You. And You already accomplished it all. Amen!

News from A NEW JOURNEY LUTHERAN PARISH...

- The Call Committee met for the first time on August 10 for an orientation. Sue Steinmetz was selected to serve as the Committee Chair and a survey was drafted for congregational members to respond. Pastor Rebel Hurd, our Northwestern Minnesota Synod's Director for Evangelical Mission, joined the meeting via speakerphone. The Call Committee meets with Pastor Rebel again on Thursday, September 8, to begin preparations for entering the interview phase of the call process.
- Our Parish has been awarded A Go For It Grant of \$5,000. The check just arrived funded by the generosity of "Over and Above Donors" throughout our Northwestern Minnesota Synod. The Go For It grant application was submitted several months ago by our Parish Practicing Resurrection Team for the purpose of supporting efforts to build up each congregation through their reaching out together in their shared mission field.
- Wednesday Night Worship will continue the 3rd Wednesday of each month at Immanuel (in conjunction with Confirmation Class, but is open to ALL!). Other worship opportunities can be scheduled by contacting Rachel.
- Sunday School will start at Gary and at Our Savior's on September 11 and will meet every Sunday at both locations. Sunday School will start at Immanuel on September 18 and meet on the first and third Sundays of each month.
- Confirmation Classes will be held every other Wednesday from 6:00-8:00 p.m. at Immanuel. On the first Wednesday of the month, they will have a two-hour class. On the third Wednesday of the month, they will complete lessons from 6-7:00 p.m. and then attend Worship from 7-8:00 p.m. Both hours are a part of Confirmation Class. If all students attend, there will be 10 students this year. We need one mentor for each student, to begin meeting with students later this fall and throughout the school year. Let Katie know if you'd like to volunteer (one session a month)!
