Notice of Special Congregational Meetings: Special meetings of the congregational membership at Gary, Immanuel, Ness and Our Savior's will be held in association with worship services on Sunday, November 13, to vote on the Call Committee's recommendation to call a Pastor that they are confident will be a good fit in our Parish. *Please attend so you can cast your ballot*.

As a result, the Call Committee recommends the parish move forward, and the parish council agreed to bring this decision forward to a parish vote. A MESSAGE FROM KATIE DEMARAIS, SAM...

"Each of us should become a Christ to the other. And as we are Christs to one another, the result is that Christ fills us all and we become a truly Christian community."

(Martin Luther. The Freedom of a Christian. 84)

We as Lutheran Christian congregations celebrate Reformation Day on October 31 every year. We remember and celebrate Martin Luther's posting of his 95 Theses on the door of the Wittenburg Castle Church. Luther was upset by many practices of the medieval Catholic Church. His goal though was to reform the Church, not to create a new one. He felt that religions, congregations, and indeed individual people, should always be reforming. We should always be looking inward to discern if we are following God's Word and God's way, creating change when it is needed, and striving to be the best Christians we can be, in order to carry out God's mission.

I know that I have spoken greatly about us being made new or in a time of creative transition lately. I am going to do it again, because I fully agree with Luther on this point. We are created and empowered by God to be a creation capable and in need of constant reforming. Of waking up each day, setting aside the sin that had a hold on us yesterday, confessing and receiving God's forgiveness, so that we can be reformed, ready to be Christ's light in the world today. We were re-formed in our baptisms, and we are re-formed daily when we strive to live in God's love for us.

We have an opportunity right now to enter into a time of reformation for our microcosm of our Church. As congregations and a united parish, November 1 is the official start date of our newly formed bond. We chose to share in ministry: the mission field, the workload, the staff, the resources, and the gifts/talents of our collective communities. Now we have an exciting opportunity to shape what we want that ministry to look like in practice. While doing so, let us look to this quote from Luther, to see Christ in each other and be Christs to each other, so that Christ fills us and leads our Christian community. Through prayer, let us discern where God is calling us. Through conversation, let us share our ideas. Through worship and praise, let us thank God for this opportunity. Through ministry, let us spread the Word of God far and wide, for that is our sacred mission.

2023 tentative budget: The tentative budget is set at \$184,000 - not knowing the pastoral part yet. M/S/P - Jim/Kristi - President Mike will talk with Sundal about their portion of funds remaining - see if it will be ok to leave their share as credit balance and for November and December will get pastoral assistance from ANJLP. The balance at the end of October will be rolled into a new account for ANJLP.

Next meeting - no date was set - wait and see.

No further business President Mike called for a motion to adjourn. M/S/P - Becky/Kristi to adjourn at 8:25 pm. We closed with the Lord's Prayer.
