A MESSAGE FROM KATIE DEMARAIS, SAM...

"Let there be light!" Aww... nothing. That is, though, how I turn on my lights in my house. I can walk in the door, hands full, and say, 'Alexa, let there be light!' and as if by magic, all of the lights in my house come on. We read in Genesis that those are the words that God spoke into the 'Darkness, "Let there be light!" And God saw that the light was good, and God separated the light from the darkness. God called the light Day, and the darkness he called Night. We just enjoyed the Christmas Candlelight Service at each of our congregations, when we focused on and enjoyed different forms of light while worshipping the Lord and celebrating His birth.

Most folks say that the Candlelight Service is their favorite worship experience of the entire year. The tradition of turning off the lights, holding onto candles, singing "Silent Night" is something so treasured. Why is that? It is beautiful, yes, but is there something divine about creating darkness, and then small beacons of light fill the sanctuary, and we can focus all of our energy, our sight, and our hearts on Jesus? By creating darkness, we eliminate the distractions. We have to narrow our focus, and we become more aware of just ourselves, our hearts beating, and aware of how God is living within those heartbeats. By lighting and holding a candle, we are reminded that Jesus is indeed the light of the world, come for you and for me.

It is easier to believe those words, those promises of God's love and salvation, as there is darkness all around us, and we are holding candles, swaying and singing of that holy night. When we can block out all of the distractions of the world, and focus just on the flame, we can feel God's presence, and we can believe those promises are indeed for us. But, when the lights come back on, when we walk out the sanctuary doors, when the twinkling lights on our Christmas trees are packed away for another year, then what? Do we still believe? Do we still feel the presence of Jesus in our heartbeats? I hope so, but honestly, it gets a lot harder, doesn't it?

So, how do we take this feeling, this solemn candlelight feeling, and keep it with us all year long? I think it has something to do with that dark and light. When God created the Light, which he called good, he didn't call the darkness bad, the darkness just is. Darkness is the natural state of the world. We as humans have created so many forms of technology to not have to sit in that natural state of darkness. Beginning with fire, to smart devices that turn on all the lightbulbs with a spoken command, we as humans don't like to just be in the dark. But maybe we need to every now and then; maybe we need darkness to dim all the distractions, the stresses, the urges, the addictions, and just be. Feel your heart beat, focus on God's love come to earth as that infant King, and pray. Spend some time conversing with God in the darkness, so that you are ready to see God's light as it is at work in this world. To see the normal, everyday beacons of light and hope that exist in this world and in each other. Not only ready to see God's light, but to BE God's light. For Jesus is the Light of the World, and we are called to be His hands and His feet. Until he comes again, we are commanded to love and serve our neighbors. We are to bring God's hope, love, and light to those who may only know the darkness, who may not feel God's presence in their heartbeats.

The meeting was held at Bejou and called to order by President Mike Nelson at 6:04 p.m. Members present - Becky Olson, Mike Nelson, Karen Carlsrud, Marilyn Graff, Jim Steinmetz, Kristi Skeie. Staff - SAM Katie DeMarais, Rachel Roggenbuck. Devotions by Mike.

Secretary's report - M/S/P - Jim/Marilyn, to approve minutes from November 16, 2022, meeting. Treasurer's report - copies passed out and reviewed. M/S/P - Jim/Becky, to approve the report thru November, 2022.

Staff report - Rachel and Katie commented caroling went well - blue service was good but cold so poor attendance. Pastor Renè's first service is January 15, and installation service for her is February 5 at Immanuel. Mike gave an update on paperwork being completed for the new parish.
