SCAM ALERT (by Pastor René)

In early March, some people received an unusual email from Pastor Keith Zeh, that read:

"Blessings!"

"Do you have a moment? I do have a request for you, let me know if you got free time."

This was NOT sent from Pastor Keith. It was a phishing scam, an attempt by scammers to lure church members to respond to the request. Sometimes it includes a specific request like purchasing gift cards.

The scammers often have the local pastor's (or even the bishop's) name and an email address that looks legitimate. But looking carefully, the email address is from a provider different than the one the church typically uses or a variation in the pastor's actual email address. For example, the sender's name may look correct but is missing a single letter. In the new version, the phishers use text messaging to try and fill up the collection plate in their favor.

So, if you get an email or text that you're suspicious about, what should you do? According to the Federal Trade Commission (FTC) that works with these situations, they recommend the following:

1. Don't email or text back to the message received. Legitimate companies won't ask you to verify your identity through unsecured channels, like text or email. If it doesn't sound like the person you know, it probably isn't.

2. Don't click on any links within the message. Links can install malware on your device and take you to spoof sites to try to get your information.

3. Report the message to your cell phone carrier's spam text reporting number. If you're an AT&T, T-Mobile, Verizon, Sprint, or Bell customer, you can forward the text to 7726 (SPAM) free of charge. The best advice might be to forward any suspicious emails or texts to the FTC at <u>https://reportfraud.ftc.gov/</u>.

One last note: as mentioned before, if you get anything that doesn't sound like the person you know, DO NOT OPEN OR RESPOND TO THE MESSAGE. Carefully look at the email. Delete it immediately and if an email, empty the trash. If you are wondering about the message, contact the person directly but not by replying to the message you received. Also, please let the person know as they may not know this is happening.

I often wonder the possible good the world is missing as people use their energy and effort on these scams instead of trying to make the world a better place. We are called to help our neighbors in need, and unfortunately we may need to verify that first.

Together with Pastor Chuck Smith (Kelsey Grammer), they open the doors of Smith's languishing church to an unexpected revival of radical and newfound love, leading to what TIME Magazine dubbed a JESUS REVOLUTION." The part of the film that stood out to me most was once Pastor Chuck Smith invited Lonnie Frisbee into his church, more and more hippie folks showed up. Elders from the church grew concerned that these hippies were going to take over their church, and one piped up with a concern, "They come in barefoot. We just put new carpet down last year!" (paraphrased) So, Pr. Smith bows down to the concerned elders. He literally bows down. The next scene is him, on his knees with a bowl of water and a towel, washing the bare feet of every flower child coming into the church. What a powerful reminder of what we are called to do!

I left that theater filled with motivation (and I'll admit, a touch of jealousy). What it must have been like to have been a part of that movement. To have witnessed hundreds of people being baptized daily in the ocean waters. I want to be a part of a movement like that. Luckily for me, I am a part of a movement: A New Journey Lutheran Parish. We have God on our side, to shepherd us, and we have the passion, gifts, and willing disciples to be able to enact real ministry that brings people to Jesus. If we listen to where God is calling us, and we open our eyes to the people in our communities who are hungry for something, even if they don't know yet that it is Jesus they are seeking. Minutes - A New Journey Parish Special Council Meeting (6:30 p.m. on March 15, 2023, at Immanuel Lutheran, Bejou, MN)

Council members present: Jim Steinmetz, Karen Carlsrud, Stacey Knudson, Peggy Hanson, Teresa Werpy, Mary Preisler and Wanda Stordahl. Others in attendance: Pastor René Mehlberg, Katie DeMarais, Rachel Roggenbuck, Mike Nelson and Sue Gunderson.

The meeting was called to order by President Jim Steinmetz followed by devotions led by Mary Preisler.

Secretary's report: Minutes were distributed and it was decided to continue to include complete minutes in our monthly parish newsletter. Motion was made by Mary, seconded by Wanda and carried, to approve the minutes of the parish council meeting held February 15, 2023.

Treasurer's report: Reports were distributed and reviewed by Mike in Jill's absence. Motion was made by Peggy, seconded by Teresa and carried, to approve reports as presented.

Staff report:

Pastor René reported she has moved and is getting settled into a home east of Bejou. She noted that she will be away on Sunday, March 19, and Rachel will be filling in for her. Pastor also reviewed the worship schedule for Holy Week.

Katie gave a confirmation report and indicated that she plans to have a First Communion class at Immanuel following worship service on Palm Sunday. She also noted that they are working on worship coverage for Palm Sunday. Katie indicated that the cost of her required mentor Pastor Laurie Albertson is \$75 per month. A motion was made by Karen, seconded by Mary and carried, to pay the mentor fees for Katie.

Rachel indicated a worship team meeting will be scheduled to discuss and plan spring and summer activities. She reported that the "outside our walls" audio/visual equipment has been ordered and will be delivered to her home where it will be kept until further notice. Guidelines for the use of the equipment are being developed. Rachel also reported that Sunday, April 30, is the fifth Sunday of the month and ideas are being considered as to how to make the fifth Sunday worship services special. Discussion followed on having joint worship services on the fifth Sundays of a month and it was decided to have it at Immanuel in April, at McIntosh in July and at Gary/Ness in October.

Old Business:

Council members were reminded to continue work on updating their membership numbers as October 1 is the deadline set for providing that information, which will determine each congregation's 2024 financial obligations to the Parish budget.

It was noted that Ness Lutheran is still working on getting a second representative to serve on the Parish Council.

New Business:

Wanda mentioned that Thrivent has funds available for congregations and Thrivent members. Discussion was held on how some of those funds have been and can be used.

Other Business:

Discussion was held on fundraising, both as individual congregations and as a parish, and other ways to build relationships by working together.

For parish membership reference, it was noted that the April newsletter will include a list, with contact information, of Parish Council members, as well as congregational officers.

The next ANJLP Parish Council meeting was scheduled for 6:30 p.m. on Wednesday, April 12, 2023, at Immanuel Lutheran, Bejou. The meeting adjourned.
