Did you know that when a new Child of God is baptized, the congregation makes promises to them? One of those promises is for all of us to support and pray for these new Children of God (of all ages). One way we are continuing to fulfill this promise is by an expansion of our Confirmation ministry to include congregational mentors.

During the Lenten season, our 11 Confirmation students were matched with an adult from our congregations to form a mentoring program. They met together on Wednesday evenings to get to know each other, learn how to ask questions, studied Psalms, and worshipped together. The hope is to continue this mentorship program as the first-year students continue next year, and to expand the program to include new students coming in the fall and beyond.

It was wonderful to see these students and adults connecting and beginning to support one another, even outside of our walls. A MESSAGE FROM PASTOR RENÉ L. MEHLBERG...

Dear Beloved Children of God:

Jeremiah 29, is not just a chapter in a book of the Bible. It is also the name of a three-year synod-wide program. I am one of 10 pastors learning about entrepreneurship, how groups form and function, and many other things. One of the main goals of the program is to come up with a project to help the welfare of the community (or in ANJLP's case, communities) of where we are.

The project is based on Jeremiah 29. The Israelites have been forced from their homes, are living in exile, and want to get back home. We all would, right? However, the Lord tells them to settle in, plant gardens, have children; do not just survive, but flourish and thrive as you will be here for a few generations.

Not necessarily the word of hope we want to hear and a bit different from the situation we find ourselves in. We are not in exile, forced from our homes. But the underlying concept of seek the welfare of where we are, does very much apply to us today.

Much work has been done over the past three years to help open our eyes to what we **do** have in and throughout ANJLP. There are many assets throughout this parish, including people, resources, and much more.

Being part of the Jeremiah 29 project is really a continuation of the work done that birthed ANJLP. It's helping find ways to make our why of "Sharing the hope that we find in Christ and the roadmap for a happy and healthy life" a reality here in this place for us and for all who live in our mission field.

So, I leave you with a challenge, the same I gave the parish council and so far two other church councils to do. Read the adapted verse of Jeremiah 29:7. Then think and wonder about the questions that follow. I truly do want to hear from you. Email, text, call, let's setup a time to meet for you to share your thoughts. Watch future newsletters and bulletins for updates to come.

But seek the welfare of the congregation and of the parish of which the Lord has created, and pray to the Lord on its behalf, for in its welfare you will find your welfare.

A MESSAGE FROM KATIE DEMARAIS, SAM...

As I sit down to write this article, I look outside and see the fresh fallen snow, making everything white. I think ahead to next weekend, when I'll go celebrate Christmas with one part of my family. To me, the snow outside was a hindrance, an annoyance. To him, it was an adventure, a memory that he'll cherish of his wonderful teacher, classmates, and throwing snowballs in fun. I needed this reminder today, and maybe you did too. To view the snow and other issues in our lives through the eyes of children. To find the fun in the midst of the annoyances, to live in the moment, and not worry so much about plans. God wants this for as well, in our faith lives.

In three of our Gospels, we hear the story of Jesus and the little children. [I invite you to read it all in Luke 18.] That is how important it is for us to come to Jesus with the eyes and the faith of little children, who seem to have an easier time with believing that God does indeed love them. Before doubts and questions and frustrations colored our perspective, faith was easier. Let us strive to return to the perspective and faith of children. Amen.

Minutes - A New Journey Parish Council Meeting (6:30 p.m. on April 12, 2023, at Immanuel Lutheran, Bejou, MN)

Council members present: Jim Steinmetz, Karen Carlsrud, Stacey Knudson, Peggy Hanson, Teresa Werpy, Mary Preisler and Wanda Stordahl. Others in attendance: Pastor René Mehlberg, Katie DeMarais, Rachel Roggenbuck, Mike Nelson and Sue Gunderson.

The meeting was called to order by President Jim Steinmetz followed by devotions led by Pastor René.

Secretary's report: Minutes were distributed. Motion was made by Mary, seconded by Wanda and carried, to approve the minutes of the parish council meeting held March 15, 2023.

Treasurer's report: Reports were not available but in Jill's absence, Mike indicated we are sitting okay and that a more thorough report will be provided in May.

Staff report:

Katie reported that 4 students completed First Communion training. Confirmation services are scheduled at Gary, for Gary and Ness students, on April 16, Immanuel on May 7, and Our Savior's on May 14. There are students who are showing an interest in attending Bible Camp this summer. As was done last year, a motion was made by Teresa, seconded by Mary and carried, to have the Parish pay for half of the registration fee for students going to Bible Camp in 2023. ANJLP participation in area baccalaureate services was reviewed.

Rachel reported that the ordered audio/visual equipment has arrived at her home and she is working on procedures for the use of that equipment. She indicated there were lots of good ideas suggested at the recent worship team meeting and there will be another meeting in May to further discuss acting on some of those ideas. She reminded everyone that the joint worship at Immanuel on Sunday, April 30, will be a little different and we are calling it "Food, Faith and Fellowship."

Pastor René mentioned updating the membership directories and suggested working toward individual congregational directories, as well as a parish-wide directory. On-line giving was reviewed, and it was noted that staff is researching options for on-line giving they will bring back to the Parish Council for review. Pastor René shared that this year's Synod Assembly will be hybrid, with people meeting in 4 different locations throughout the synod. Our closest places are East Grand Forks and Bemidji. Congregations/parishes are encouraged to attend the same location. She asked if congregations had reps selected. Peggy Hanson and Jenny Lien plan to attend; and Jimmy indicated Immanuel may have members attending. Pastor suggested that we try to put together a parish-wide annual congregation and community calendar of events; and that information can be forwarded to Sue Gunderson to assemble. Pastor is looking for a 2-drawer letter size file cabinet and filing supplies to have at Immanuel for official parish documents and also indicated it would be good to have the copier connected to Internet.

The Council read through the current Parish Agreement as a reminder to what the purpose and vision is of ANJLP.

Old Business:

Jimmy reminded everyone that work should continue on updating each congregation's membership list. Rough membership numbers should be available for discussion at the ANJLP council meeting in August.

Ness Lutheran still does not have a second representative to serve on the Parish Council.

Mike reminded everyone about the Henriksen Fundraiser and noted that workers are needed to help at the fundraiser.

Jimmy also reminded everyone that he has butter and hamburger that he is willing to donate for events.

New Business:

It was suggested that professional posters listing ANJLP information be developed for posting around the area.

Discussion was held on Thrivent funds that are available to Thrivent consumers.

It was noted that members like Wednesday evening services, especially those who are not able to attend Sunday morning worship. Plans are to continue with the Wednesday services during the summer months, and ideas for where those summer services may be held were discussed.

The next ANJLP Council meeting was scheduled for 6:30 p.m. on Monday, May 15, 2023, at Immanuel Lutheran, Bejou.

The meeting adjourned and we closed with the Lord's Prayer.


