■ Pastoral Care & Getting to Know God's Beloved People:

Making visits and getting to know God's beloved people is one of the great joys of ministry. It gives us a glimpse into your space and home, what life is like for you, providing an escape from paperwork and other administrative duties that are necessary, but not always fun.

Visits come in many forms: before, during, or after a procedure or hospital stay; for those in care facilities or homebound; when you want to talk, share an idea, or need a listening ear; would like communion. They can be over coffee or a meal or with an adventure of fishing, kayaking, walking, or something else. As ANJLP formed a little over a year ago, Pastor René is compiling a list of those who should be on a visitation list. This includes people who are in health care/assisted living facilities, those homebound, and anyone else for whatever reason.

Thank-you to those who have shared names and more help is needed to make sure no one is missed. If you know of someone who should be added to the list or contacted for a visit, let Pastor René know.

Parish staff appreciate when people proactively reach out to schedule a visit. We truly do! It's easy to call when we hear news of someone wanting a visit, but even then people vary in their desire for or expectations of pastoral visits.

In a perfect world, there would be 100% satisfaction in the quality and quantity of visits, but it is not a perfect world. And the parish staff are not perfect either. We do our best to get out, especially when requested. Again, please, reach out if you would like a visit, if you want to stop by one of the offices, or meet someplace else. It would be great to find time to be together!

A slight change will be happening with the staffing of ANJLP as we work to finalize a covenant with Rachel Roggenbuck to commission her as a SAM for the remainder of 2023. We are hopeful that finances make it possible to keep Rachel in that role for 2024 and beyond.

The primary focus for Rachel in this position will be pastoral care/visitation. This would include creating a list from each church of the people (and their place) for ongoing visits and those when a life event happens (illness, death, etc.). The SAM would be the lead while working with the pastor/mission developer (myself), other SAM (Katie DeMarais), and lay leaders to connect with and care for those in need. As the faithful have since the beginning of time, we hold onto hope and onto God while asking for God's steadfast love to be upon us, to be felt by us, to be known by us, and to be shared through us.

A MESSAGE FROM KATIE DEMARAIS, SAM...

"And this is my prayer, that your love may overflow more and more with knowledge and full insight to help you to determine what really matters, so that in the day of Christ you may be pure and blameless, having produced the harvest of righteousness that comes through Jesus Christ for the glory and praise of God." ~ Philippians 1:9-11

I have good news to share with you again this month, besides the true Good News that is always shared! At the beginning of June, our NWMN Synod Bishop Tesch sent a note to all who are serving as Synod Authorized Ministers (SAMs), inviting us to apply for a new partnership between the synods in our region and Luther Seminary in St. Paul. This partnership is creating and awarding 3 applicants per synod a full scholarship to a graduate certificate program in Christian Ministry through Luther, to better equip lay leaders to serve congregations. In July, I applied and was chosen as a full scholarship recipient. This program sounded like a wonderful way to fulfill many things in my calling:

1) To gain knowledge and insight in theology and ministry so that I can be the best SAM I can be to serve with you, like is written in Philippians.

2) To test the waters of my educational and call journey, as these classes will be applicable if ever I am ready and called to pursue a master's degree program.

3) To fulfill the educational requirements for my SAM call.

The details, if you are wondering...the program calls for one seminary course per semester, eight total over two years. I will be able to complete the majority of it online, through distance learning, but I will need to be on-campus in St. Paul for three days each semester (the first being September 20-22). This does NOT mean that I will be an ordained Pastor at the completion of this graduate certificate program. That would call for another number of courses, an internship, and the approval and backing of a Synod Candidacy Committee. These courses would count, however, towards that degree if ever I feel called to pursue that path.

I will continue in my current call with you all, which has been and will remain parttime. Even as our staff roles grow and shift, I will continue to focus on Children, Youth, and Family ministry, including Confirmation, as well as preaching and my other duties.

I am thankful to Pr. René, Rachel, parish staff, and parish leadership for their support while I embark on this new adventure. Please keep me and my family in your prayers for changing roles, time away, and most of all that I may soak up wonderful knowledge and be better trained to share God's message of Hope and Love.

A MESSAGE FROM RACHEL ROGGENBUCK... ANJLP Worship Life Coordinator

Often, my articles look back at what we have done and how it is shaping where we are. We have done a fabulous job of continuing to meet each other where we are, growing together in community, and forging stronger relationships as we go forth to share the Good News. Do Not Be Afraid. Prayer is something that is both personal and public, and something that can be done anywhere, anytime, by anyone. There are also many different ways to pray, including the breath prayer. We don't take enough time to pause and breathe in God's presence and to breathe out all that is not of God. Take a couple of moments to try the following breath prayer to see how it feels for you.

A Prayer to Breathe: By Sarah Bessey

Breath prayer is an ancient form of prayer easily adaptable for anyone. Simply choose one or two lines to meditate on, and inhale and then exhale through them. Once common form of breath prayer is known as the Jesus Prayer:
