MESSAGE FROM PASTOR RENÉ L. MEHLBERG...

Dear Beloved Children of God:

Fall is in the air even as we soak in the lingering warm days. The school year is well on its way with MEA weekend around the corner. Faith formation in its various forms (confirmation, Sunday School, family afternoons) has or will soon start. Some familiar rhythms return, even as the seasons change.

At the August parish council meeting, Rachel Roggenbuck's covenant as a SAM was approved! It was officially signed by Bishop Bill Tesch on September 11 with a commissioning soon to follow. The people and communities of ANJLP are fortunate and very blessed to have this ministry team who work with and care for the people of God throughout our vast mission field.

As written last month, Rachel will focus on caring ministry by visiting people and connecting with them when life events happen. If you or someone you know would like a visit or a call, contact Rachel. This work is in addition to her responsibilities of Worship Life Coordinator. She will continue to preach as needed and will soon be able to preside at communion and baptisms, Lutherans' two sacraments. Rachel's responsibilities are about 13 hours a week.

Katie's SAM work continues focusing on Children, Youth, and Family by leading Confirmation and Youth Group. She provided leadership with VBS and is a support for Sunday School/Faith Formation at the individual churches. She also led the parish to adopt a Children and Youth Safety Policy, which passed in September. She regularly leads worship, having one Sunday off a month. Katie's responsibilities are about 20 hours a week.

As your full-time pastor/mission developer, I work with and lead the parish staff team to ensure God's work is being done. This includes a vast array of responsibilities: leading worship; being out in the communities attending events and learning, meeting, and talking with people; working with each church and their leadership to reach their goals, dreaming about and trying different ways to connect with God's beloved people, and so much more. I am blessed to be working with this team and each of you.

I ask for your prayers and patience, love and grace as we all continue to live into this holy, messy work the Holy Spirit is up to in each church, our communities, and the parish. We need one another in so many ways as we lean in and continue sharing God's love and promises to all.

How being Christian is like being a Pumpkin:



1) We are hand selected

God hand selects us! We are chosen! Very much like in the verse John 15:16, where Jesus is giving the Vine and the Branches illustration, reads:

"You did not choose me, but I chose you and appointed you so that you might go and bear fruit- fruit that will last- and so that whatever you ask in my name the father will give you." – John 15:16

2) We are washed clean

We all know how dirty pumpkins can appear at times! In order to clean them, of course we have to wash them! The blood of Jesus washes away our sins, the things that make us as humans unclean. Minutes - A New Journey Parish Council Meeting

(7:30 p.m. on August 28, 2023, at Immanuel Lutheran, Bejou, MN)

Council members present: Jim Steinmetz, Karen Carlsrud, Stacey Knudson, Wanda Stordahl, Peggy Hanson, Teresa Werpy, and Becky Olson (for Mary Preisler). Others in attendance: Pastor René Mehlberg, Katie DeMarais, Rachel Roggenbuck, and Sue Gunderson. Also in attendance for a portion of the meeting to discuss Bible Camp were Shelley and Lavonne Sannes.

The meeting was called to order by President Jim Steinmetz followed by devotions led by Pastor René.

Secretary's report: Minutes were distributed. Motion was made by Becky, seconded by Teresa and carried, to approve the minutes of the parish council meeting held July 10, 2023.

Treasurer's report: In Jill Nelson's absence, Katie distributed and reviewed the financial reports. A motion was made by Becky, seconded by Peggy and carried, to approve the treasurer's report as presented. Pastor René and Jimmy will work on the Portico Benefit annual enrollment for 2024 budget purposes. It was noted that we received 501c3 federal exemption under ELCA and are still waiting on our parish Minnesota sales tax exemption certificate.

New business:

Shelley Sannes' daughter was one of the students ANJLP paid for to attend Bible Camp this summer. Shelley voiced safety concerns she and her daughter had while being at Bible Camp; and felt the Council should be aware of their concerns when considering sponsoring future students to attend the Camp. Parish Staff will continue to work to offer safe and meaningful opportunities for faith formation, including Bible Camp, and will be taking this information under advisement as opportunities are presented to families in the future.

A question was raised whether or not the Parish should send letters to area schools reminding them that religious events often occur on Wednesday evenings and that they should respect that day when scheduling school activities. Katie indicated she has not run into much problem with conflicts and that she has been able to work around school activities, so no action will be taken at this time.

Staff report:

Katie indicated that she is working on an expanded Confirmation class schedule and will meet with students and their parents/guardians on September 17. Let her know if there are any students in 7th grade or older that should be invited. She expects there will be 10+ students in Confirmation this year. Katie is also working on a Safety & Abuse Prevention Policy for the Parish and handed out a draft to council members to review prior to a discussion at the next council meeting.

Rachel reported on the good turnout at the Family Fun Event at Immanuel on August 27. Ideas for a 2024 Revival are being worked on, as well as inviting a gospel singer from Branson to join us for an event next year. A worship team meeting will be held sometime in September or early October. Rachel administers the text-em-all program used primarily for reminders and prayer requests. Parish staff are working to maximize this resource to include sub-groups such as parish council, confirmation families, etc.

Pastor René presented the Licensure Approving Synod Authorized Minister for Rachel and indicated that hiring Rachel for the remainder of 2023 as a SAM is within the 2023 budget. A motion was made by Teresa, seconded by Peggy and carried to approve hiring Rachel Roggenbuck for the remainder of 2023 and authorize the Licensure as presented.

Old Business:

Preliminary membership numbers (based on number of confirmands) for each congregation to be used for 2024 budgeting purposes were reported as follows.

September 30, 2023, is the deadline for final numbers to be reported at the October ANJLP council meeting.

Other business:

Upcoming parish events include the meatball dinner at Our Savior's on September 17, and the Synod Road Trip at Our Savior's on September 21. Pastor René asked that everyone be considering when and where services should be held on Christmas Eve day (Sunday morning), Christmas Eve night, Christmas Day, and New Year's Eve Day (Sunday).

It was mentioned that the Synod is having a Zoom training at 6:30 p.m. on September 11 that may be beneficial for treasurers of each of our congregations to attend at Immanuel as it may be helpful when preparing the 2024 budget. It may also be beneficial for those treasurers to stay for the ANJLP Council meeting which will follow the Zoom training.

The next ANJLP Council meeting was scheduled for 7:30 p.m. on Monday, seconded by Stacey and carried, to adjourn. The meeting closed with the Lord's Prayer.

Minutes - A New Journey Parish Council Meeting

(7:30 p.m. on September 11, 2023, at Immanuel Lutheran, Bejou, MN)

Council members present: Jim Steinmetz, Karen Carlsrud, Stacey Knudson, Wanda Stordahl, Peggy Hanson, Teresa Werpy, and Mary Preisler. Others in attendance: Pastor René Mehlberg, Katie DeMarais, Rachel Roggenbuck, Sue Gunderson and Jill Nelson. Also in attendance for a portion of the meeting were Ness Lutheran members Mike Sather & Harry Kveno. Mike Hagy stayed for the entire meeting.

The meeting was called to order by President Jim Steinmetz followed by devotions led by Pastor René.

Secretary's report: Minutes were distributed. Motion was made by Wanda, seconded by Peggy and carried, to approve the minutes of the parish council meeting held August 28, 2023.

Treasurer's report: Jill distributed and reviewed the financial reports, which also incuded the following: payroll taxes will now be deposited monthly rather than biweekly; the Portico benefit annual enrollment is due October 13 and being worked on; the bulk mailing permit expires in April 2024 so we will need to reapply under the new parish name and decide what post office we want to use for mailing our newsletters; Rachel's hours as of September 1, 2023, will now be paid at the SAM rate; mileage for employees should be reported from what is determined to be their base location; Jill will work with Katie to determine the timing of her mentor's pay; and we are still waiting for our MN sales tax exemption certificate. A motion was made by Peggy, seconded by Wanda and carried, to approve the treasurer's report as presented.

On behalf of Ness Lutheran, Harry Kveno reported on how their Trust Fund (money received as part of an estate gift) is set up and how that impacts them financially.

Staff report:

Katie indicated letters have gone out to confirmands and that she plans to meet with parents/guardians and students on Sunday, September 17, prior to the Youth Group gathering at Immanuel. Confirmation classes will start in October and will be held the first Sunday and Wednesday, and third Wednesday of each month at Immanuel.

Rachel indicated that a Worship Team meeting has been scheduled for September 28 at Immanuel. Also, October 29 is the fifth Sunday of the month so there will be a joint worship at Gary followed by lunch. She will be attending the Synod Fall Theological Retreat at Detroit Lakes Fair Hills on September 17-19 with Pastor René. She looks forward to providing caring ministry so if there is anyone who needs her to visit them, please let her know.

Pastor René reported that the Bishop signed off on Rachel's application to be a SAM, so Rachel will start those added duties to her schedule. New housing options are being considered for Pastor René as the owner of the rental needs to move in by November 1. She wishes to remain close to the center of the parish.

Old Business:

There were no changes suggested to the draft Safety & Abuse Prevention Policy Katie presented at the last Parish council meeting. A motion was made by Mary, seconded by Wanda, to approve the Parish Safety & Abuse Policy as presented. Background checks will be conducted per the policy. It was suggested that each individual congregation consider adopting and following the same type of policy.

Teresa reported that the Gary Lutheran Council discussed the issues that came up at our meeting last month concerning Bible Camp and recommending not sending youth to Pathways Bible Camp or provide financial support until concerns are addressed. They are looking into other Bible Camp options. Pastor René will work

with the concerned family to draft a letter to Pathways. She also spoke to the Board Chair of Pathways about our concerns; and she will talk to each Parish family who had kids go to Bible Camp this summer.

Pastor René led discussion on membership numbers and how we come together in faith and trust while being mindful of the financial resources each church has to contribute to the parish budget. Thank-you to each congregation for working on their membership list. After discussion it was decided for each church to come to the October Parish Council meeting with the following numbers: confirmands; those confirmed, have communed, and have given (financially or in-kind) within the last year; those confirmed and communed or given (financially or in-kind) within the last year; and households. It was also suggested that each council look at what they are currently paying toward the parish budget, and their ability in 2024 to pay the same, pay more, or need to pay less.

New business:

The 2024 budget is something all should be considering, as well as whether or not there are areas that can be eliminated or reduced. We will know more after the membership numbers are finalized.

The staff are working with each church council to come up with a worship schedule for the Christmas Eve, Christmas Day and New Year's Eve holidays.

Other business:

The Council was reminded that the Synod Road Trip will be at Our Savior's on Thursday, September 21.

The next ANJLP Council meeting was scheduled for 7:30 p.m. on Monday, October 16, 2023, at Immanuel Lutheran, Bejou. The meeting adjourned and closed with the Lord's Prayer.

September 10, 2023 Council Meeting

The Gary Lutheran Church Council meeting was held on Sunday, September 10, 2023 following 10:30 worship. Present were Bonnie Werpy, Gene Werpy, Teresa Werpy, Peggy Hanson, Gene Hanson, Carrie Heisler, Pastor René Mehlberg, and guests Shelley Sannes and LaVonne Sannes.

Bonnie called the meeting to order. It was decided that we would do the new business first to let Shelley and LaVonne speak and then do the old business. Agenda was approved.

The secretary's report was read by Peggy. Carrie made a motion to accept, seconded by Gene Werpy and carried.

The treasurer's report showed an ending balance of \$29,476.69. Gene Werpy reported that he has a \$250 gift card from Thrivent to be used for expenses for the Harvest Dinner on November 19. Motion was made by Gene Hanson to approve the treasurer's report and seconded by Gene Werpy and carried.

New Business-

Shelley Sannes talked about her daughter's experience at Bible camp. Her daughter along with other campers were very uncomfortable there. Pastor René said she would talk with the President of the board at Pathways. After much discussion Carrie made a motion that we recommend not going there, not giving Pathways money for now with a written letter with our concerns (by Shelley and Pastor René) and having Pastor René reach out to the board with our concerns. The motion was seconded by Teresa and carried.

Old Business-

Second SAM position – Everything is going well. Still working out details of Rachel's responsibility with the Caring Ministry. Pastor René was wondering if we want to have a set time for church now that we have 2 SAMs. Carrie suggested we have Sunday School during church. She had heard from different parents with children that they would like that. We may have more parents willing to teach also. The suggestion was for church at 9:30 (1st choice) or 10:30 (2nd choice) with Sunday School during church. Pastor René said she would work with Katie and Rachel to see if this is possible. Gene Hanson made a motion that starting in October and for the rest of the year we have Sunday School during church and see how it works. The motion was seconded by Carrie and it was carried. Sunday School will remain at 9:30 in September.

<u>Leaking Roof</u> – Carrie talked to Byron Thronson about the leaky roof. He felt it was not caused by ice jam but by how the office is connected to the church.

<u>Membership</u> – As of today our membership is 185. 69 have communed. Gary's amount that they pay to the parish will go up substantially. Pastor René had copies of Gary church membership. A copy was given to each council member to contact members who have not been active.

Sound System – Put on hold.

Sunday School Printing – Posters will be made.

<u>Other business-</u> Pastor René thanked Bonnie, Gene Werpy and Brock Nelson for fixing the bell. Pastor René reported that VBS went well. She said that Katie has 11 students in confirmation as of now. If you know of anyone who would like to be in confirmation you should contact Katie. Pastor René also said that October 29th is a

5th Sunday so we would only have 1 church service and it will be hosted at Gary. 10 am worship with a possible potluck afterwards. There will be no Sunday School that day. Christmas Eve is on a Sunday this year. It was decided that we would not have Sunday morning service. We would have our traditional Christmas Eve service that evening.

The next council meeting will be November 26th.

Carrie made a motion to adjourn the meeting and seconded by Gene Hanson and carried.
