MESSAGE FROM PASTOR RENÉ L. MEHLBERG... "Our Finest Gifts We Bring"

Dear Beloved Children of God:

Can you believe Hallmark started its "Countdown to Christmas" movies on October 20?!?! Some of you knew; I did not. I knew they started early, but didn't realize THAT early until looking it up.

It's easy to "eye-spy" signs of Christmas every place you go, with more to come! For many, there is comfort and joy in the sights and the sounds of the Christmas season.

I'm not trying to "hum-bug" your Christmas joy as I remind you that in our churches Advent comes before Christmas. Advent is the season of waiting, watching, and preparing for Christ's birth as we also wait, watch, and prepare for Christ to come again.

Advent begins four Sundays prior to Christmas. With Christmas Eve on Sunday this year, we will celebrate Advent 4 on Wednesday night, December 20.

Gift giving and receiving is one way we prepare for Christmas. A tradition perhaps stemming from the gifts the Wise Men gave to toddler Jesus. But perhaps it is also a reminder of the greatest gift God has given us: that of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. For God coming to us in the flesh, teaching and showing us how to live and love, and be in relationship with one another.

In this season of gifts (that can too easily get out of control), I challenge you to consider what gift (or gifts) you could share with your church, the parish, your community. Now I fully realize, many of you are already doing this. There are many gifts and talents being shared. And I wonder, what other gifts are out there that people could share if they are asked? However, I or other parish staff, may not know the gifts you have that you wish to share.

Do you have a love of crafting or decorating? Cleaning through files or organizing? Calling or reaching out to people? Are you handy and could help with small projects? Perhaps a musical talent we do not even know about.

During worship in the Advent season, you will be encouraged to consider the gifts and skills you have and are willing to share. By knowing what people are good at and passionate about sharing allows parish staff to tap into the gifts already here. Sharing our gifts is another way we share God's love and promises with others.

We must remember that much of what we need is already here. Consider the song, "The Little Drummer Boy." He thought, "I have no gift to bring, that's fit to give our King." But that little drummer boy shared what he had, the best he could. And that made baby Jesus smile.

May we share the gifts we have with one another as we love God, love our neighbors, and make Jesus and each other smile!

A MESSAGE FROM KATIE DEMARAIS, SAM...

"But as for you, continue in what you have learned and firmly believed, knowing from whom you learned it and how from childhood you have known sacred writings that are able to instruct you for salvation through faith in Christ Jesus. All scripture is inspired by God and is useful for teaching, for reproof, for correction, and for training in righteousness, so that the person of God may be proficient, equipped for every good work." ~ 2 Timothy 3:16-1

This past month, we as a Parish have given 10 Holy Bibles to young people. We have helped families to fulfill one of the promises they made to the children in their lives at the time of the baptisms: to place in their hands the Holy Scriptures. I want to thank the people of this Parish for your support in this milestone. You help in the form of offering, encouragement of our youth and children, and your prayers for their continued faith formation.

I was chatting with a family before their young person received their Bible. The mom, grandma, and great-grandma all told the child how they still have their Bible they received from the church when they were young. They even have the Bibles of their ancestors who have since gone home to Jesus. We talked about how Bibles of older generations were used to record special dates such as their baptism, confirmation, weddings, and more. Folks underlined special verses and wrote in the margins. Funeral instructions, including favorite hymns, were tucked in the pages. Some of the pages became so dog-eared or worn out, that the verses were hard to read. How beautiful is that treasured inheritance: to see that your grandma's, dad's, or godparent's Bible was so used that the cover is worn thin, and the comfort in getting to read through their favorite verses! Is your Bible so used? If yes, I'm so glad. If not, it is never too late to start. Dust off that Bible (or ask a staff member, and we'd be happy to give you one!). Read it daily. Underline verses. Ask questions. Write in the margins. Not only will your family receive a treasured inheritance, but you will grow so much closer to the Lord. The Bible is not just an old book, but the Holy Word of God, with so much to teach us.

Minutes - A New Journey Parish Council Meeting (6:30 p.m. on November 20, 2023, at Immanuel Lutheran, Bejou, MN)

Others: Pastor René, Katie DeMarais, Rachel Roggenbuck, Mike Nelson, Jill Nelson and Sue Gunderson. Jim called the meeting to order and Pr René led devotions and prayer. <u>Secretary's Report</u>: Minutes were distributed and reviewed. Motion by Mary, second by Wanda and carried to approve minutes of the October 16, 2023, meeting as presented.

<u>Treasurer's Report</u>: Reports were distributed and discussed. A motion was made by Peggy, seconded by Teresa and carried, to approve the treasurer's report as presented. <u>Staff Reports</u>:

Rachel reported on the ten Blessing Boxes presented to and well received by families in the area. Rachel is reaching out to members in numerous ways, including random texts, phone calls, visitations and sending Christmas cards.

Katie reported that she attended the recent Synod Middle School Youth Gathering in Alexandria with two parish youth and the cost was covered in the parish budget. Two additional mentors are needed for confirmation that involves meeting with confirmands for 2 hours every third Wednesday. Ten Bibles were distributed to students in third grade and up.

Pastor René reminded the Council she has moved into Bejou and reviewed some of the events she has attended in the area in her mission development role. She also talked about her pastoral care role that she coordinates with Rachel.

She reported that quilters from Our Savior's and Ness have been busy and Pastor will highlight some of that work in the December newsletter.

Old Business:

All four congregation councils approved the proposed 2024 parish budget, after answering questions regarding Bible Camp and funding of the second SAM position.

Pastor René proposed an additional expense line of \$600 to the NWMN Synod Mission Support. A motion was made by Mary, seconded by Peggy and carried to approve that addition.

An online giving program, called Tithly, was discussed as an additional means of giving to the parish. Rachel will handle implementing this program for our use.

New Business:

A tentative schedule for each congregation's annual meeting was reviewed and will soon be finalized. The reports from parish staff and the parish treasurer's report will be provided to each congregation for their annual reports.

The next ANJLP Council meeting will be held Monday, December 11, at 6:30 pm. at Immanuel. The meeting adjourned and closed with the Lord's Prayer.
