New Business:

Stacey brought extra Christmas banners from Our Savior's that she offered to the other parish congregations.

Mike and Jill mentioned that the Gary council discussed the need to cut some items from Gary's 2024 budget in order to continue working within their financial means. Jim reviewed how Immanuel's fundraisers have helped Immanuel.

Mike thought his term on the parish council as a non-voting member was over the end of the year and thanked the council. The Parish council thanked Mike for his service.

Gary Lutheran Church November 26, 2023, Council Meeting Minutes

The Gary Lutheran Church council meeting was held following worship on Sunday, November 26, 2023 with Bonnie Werpy, Gene Werpy, Jill Nelson, Teresa Werpy, Peggy Hanson, Gene Hanson, Jenny Lien and Pr Rene in attendance.

Bonnie called the meeting to order. The amended agenda was approved upon motion by Teresa, second by Gene Hanson. Peggy read the secretary's report which was approved upon motion by Gene Werpy, second by Gene Hanson. Treasurer's report: Jill read the resignation of Carrie Heisler as the treasurer and gave the treasurer's report. The general fund showed an ending balance of \$28,734.57 as of October 31. The Gary quilters closed their account and donated \$1700 to the congregation to be used towards updating the sound system. The treasurer's report was approved upon motion by Gene Hanson, second by Gene Werpy, motion carried. Old Business: Gene Werpy removed the trees by the steps. Brock Nelson replaced the rope on the bell. Gene Werpy gave an update on the roof leaking issue which has been fixed. The fall dinner made about \$2300 which will be going towards the sound system and other technology needs. Thrivent donations were discussed. Peggy Hanson used her action team grant for the caramel rolls at the rummage sale, and Gene Werpy used his action team grant for the harvest lunch. Jill questioned a deposit that had been made from Thrivent labeled "Charitable Grant". Peggy Hanson will contact Thrivent to determine what this money is for. The furnace issues were discussed. We have been having issues because the moisture has been wrecking the panel. Getting a dehumidifier was discussed.

<u>New Business</u>: Teresa gave a parish update stating that the parish budget has been drafted with small changes from last year, and it was suggested to encourage any of several local Bible camps for students to attend.

The Fair Meadow Foundation is asking for donations from local churches to raise money so that they can be included in Giving Hearts Day. It was decided to take a second offering each Sunday for the month of December for this cause. Parish staff has been working with the Liberty Copier company on new contracts for Gary and Immanuel which would cost the same or less than the current cost. Treasurer appointment: Gene Hanson moved to appoint Jill Nelson as treasurer following Carrie's resignation, second by Teresa, motion carried.

It was decided to schedule the annual meeting for January 14th following 10:30 a.m. worship. Volunteers for the nominating committee are needed to fill positions on the council. A budget meeting will be held on December 10 at 9:30. Peggy moved to adjourn the meeting, second by Gene Werpy, motion carried.
