This lists who is scheduled to lead worship that day: Pastor René (PR), Katie DeMarais (KD), or Rachel Roggenbuck (RR). Having three worship leaders all authorized to preach and preside at the sacraments (communion and baptism), is truly a blessing. Scheduling worship leadership is more difficult than one may think, and parish staff does their best to rotate throughout the parish. While rare, changes to the printed schedule may occur. If you have questions about the schedule, talk with Pastor René.

Rachel Roggenbuck, officially commissioned SAM!

Thank you to all who attended, watched online, and kept in prayer Rachel as she was officially commissioned as a Synod Authorized Minister on February 4. It was a joy-filled worship with Pastor Rebel Hurd, Director of Evangelical Mission (DEM) of the NWMN Synod preaching, commissioning Rachel, and blessing the leadership team of Rachel, Katie, and Pastor René. Much food and fellowship followed. Thanks be to God!



Overview of Time, Roles, and Responsibilities of the Leadership Team:

ANJLP is very blessed to have the breadth and depth of ministry leadership that they do, while we must remember the time, roles, and responsibilities each has. Yes, there are three of us, and only one of us is full-time. Here is a reminder for us all.

Pastor René: Full-time Pastor/Mission Developer. Works with and leads the parish staff team to ensure God's work is being done, as we listen to what the Holy Spirit is up to in this place. Responsibilities include working with the parish council and each church's leadership to reach their goals; building relationships within and between the churches and throughout the parish; dreaming about and trying different ways to connect with God's beloved people; leading worship; caring for people in times of need; attending school and community events to learn about the places and to meet the people of where they call home.

Katie DeMarais, SAM: Part-time, approx. 20hrs/week. Focuses on Children, Youth, and Family Ministry including leading Confirmation and Youth Group, providing leadership with VBS, and is a support for Sunday School/Faith Formation at the individual churches. She oversees the parish's Children and Youth Safety Policy. She regularly leads worship, having one Sunday off a month. She is a member of Gary Lutheran and volunteers in that capacity as well.

Rachel Roggenbuck, SAM: Part-time, approx. 13hrs/week. Focuses on Worship Outside the Walls (WOW) Ministry, oversees the text-em all program (maintaining the numbers, sending out reminders, etc.), caring ministry, and worship leadership when Katie or Pastor René are gone. She is a member of Immanuel Lutheran, serving as its organist and on its council as a Board of Education member, and is an active volunteer. She also regularly serves as organist at Our Savior's.

In addition, all three have continuing education and synod expectations to meet. Because of the varying responsibilities and limited time, you may or may not see all three at every church or parish event. Feel free to contact any staff member with questions about roles or responsibilities. Please continue to pray for all in leadership roles, as we ask for your prayers and patience, love and grace as we all continue to live into this holy, messy work the Holy Spirit is up to in each church, our communities, and the parish. We need one another in so many ways as we lean in and continue sharing God's love and promises to all.

“Good Gossip”

We don't share the GOOD things we do as much as we share gossip, so each month we lift up some good ministry being done throughout the Parish.

This month we are lifting up the ministry we do with the Text-em-all service. It is one of the ways our parish is able to stay connected. It is wonderful to be connected in this way! We are able to share activities happening in the parish, including worship schedules, dinners, youth activities, council meetings, and changes to any activity. But perhaps the biggest use of this service is our prayer requests. We do our best to share as much information as possible while honoring the requests of the person or family being prayed for. Imagine being surrounded by people from all across the parish, some you have not met, praying for you. It is humbling and wonderful!

As anyone who is part of this prayerful group will tell you - sometimes the only texts they receive are schedule reminders or updates and other weeks the need for prayer is great. MESSAGE FROM PASTOR RENÉ L. MEHLBERG...

“Child of Dust. Child of God. You are loved. You are forgiven. You are enough.”

This was the Ash Wednesday “blessing” for the Imposition of Ashes. It was not even 2 days after the tragic accident that took Cody Prestegord’s life, rippling out impacting and changing so many others forever.

For me, there was much to be mindful of: the fresh tragedy reminding us once again of the fragility of life; emergency responders at the scene; individuals who have lost loved ones in similar ways; the many we know and others we don’t who carry the trauma of accidents from years ago that can bubble up once again threatening to swallow us whole. Those who have recently lost loved ones, especially suddenly and unexpectedly; those who are so very mindful that “there is no cure for being human” and that we all end up in the valley of the dry bones one day. Because of all of this, I could not impose an ashy cross on people with the words, “remember you are dust, and to dust you shall return” as we were all already too well aware of that fact.

The reminder and promise that needed to be said and most needed to be heard was, “Child of God.” As a child of God, remember the meaning of Jesus’ name: “God is with us.” God is with us especially when we find ourselves, personally or as family, friends, or as a community accompanying others, when the unimaginable happens and lives are forever changed.

I fully realize some may feel that God has left and has abandoned you. In reality, these are the times that God pulls all so very close. It is okay if you do not believe that and need to yell at God with some choice words. There are times and situations that are not right, are not fair, and simply make no sense. Our God is a big God who can handle whatever we give. God will never leave you and will help see you through.

Perhaps this is the most important reminder: there is a community of people, in the flesh, willing to be with and help one another. Reach out to me, other staff, family, friends, or others when needed. We are a community of faith **together**. It is **with** one another we will love, support, listen, cry, scream **together** and find our way into the future **together**, knowing that God is with us, right where we are.

Remember also what Sister Helen Prejean said in *Dead Man Walking*, “There are spaces of sorrow only God can touch.”

Jim called the meeting to order and Pastor René led devotions and prayer.

Secretary's Report: Minutes of the January 22, 2024, meeting were distributed and reviewed. Motion by Becky, second by Marilyn and carried, to approve minutes of the January 22, 2024, meeting as presented.

Treasurer's Report: In Jill's absence, Teresa presented her financial reports. It was noted that \$860 was received at Rachel's commissioning service. A motion was made by Kristi, seconded by Becky and carried, to retain 50% of that amount for the Parish and the other 50% will go to the Northwestern Minnesota Synod. Rachel indicated she would follow-up with the Sparkhouse subscription shared between Immanuel and the parish. A motion was made, seconded and carried, to approve the treasurer's report as presented.

Staff Reports:

Pastor René covered the following:

- Rachel's commissioning service held February 4th
- Duties provided by Pastor René, Katie and Rachel

- Recent continuing education for the NWMN Synod's Jeremiah 29 project she attended in Detroit Lakes, which will include one-on-one meetings. She would like to schedule these meetings with congregational and parish council members.
- Lenten service topic "I Saw God Today"

Rachel covered the following:

- Her thoughts and emotions as she was commissioned as a SAM
- Since Moran's closed, other locations for the Ladies' Night Out are being considered, including The Deuce in Erskine
- Tithely QR code is being included on worship broadcasts
- The work done by Rachel, Bridget and Levi to broadcast worship services and changes coming by the end of the year. Discussion followed and this ministry will continue to be evaluated throughout the year.

Katie covered the following:

- The Souper Bowl Offering and food collected will continue through February with the proceeds going to the food shelves in Erskine, Twin Valley and Mahnomen.

Old Business:

Rachel demonstrated how Tithely works and indicated that the money contributed only goes to the Parish, not individual congregations.

New Business:
