<u>TEAM GRANTS:</u> Many Thrivent members are eligible to apply twice a year for Action Team Grants of up to \$250. This is a great way to extend your church's or the parish's annual budget. Action Team Grants have supported yearly events throughout the parish including the Gary Meatball Dinner, Our Savior's Memorial Day Veteran's Lunch, ANJLP Card Ministry, mailing and office supplies. "Good Gossip"

We don't share the GOOD things we do as much as we share gossip, so each month we lift up some good ministry being done throughout the Parish.

Family Playdates are hosted in Gary once a month. They are a time for kiddos and their grown-ups to meet to play, have snacks, hear a Bible story, and for grown-ups to meet each other.

Family Playdates began in Spring 2021, when area families were invited to the Gary School Park to meet Pr. Sue Tjornahoj to talk about what young families wanted from their congregations. We began meeting every month during the warm weather months since then. In the school year 2023-24, we continued to meet monthly at Gary Lutheran Church. Kids would come off of the school bus to play and learn at the church for 2 hours. In Summer 2024, it expanded even more with a free community meal added at 5:30 each night. We have had great community involvement and donations of food from the local fire department, Community Club, Ultima Bank, and local community members (thank you Phil and Jean!). The average attendance has been over 60 people each night with many of those being kiddos!

The next Family Playdate will be at the Gary Community Park on Wednesday, August 7th. Playdate will run from 4-6pm (come anytime), a free community meal will be served at 5:30, Worship including VBS kids singing will begin at 6pm, and the Gary Farmers Market will run from 5-7pm.

Jimmy called the meeting to order and Pastor René led devotions.

<u>Secretary's Report</u>: Minutes of the April 15, 2024, and the May 13, 2024, meetings were distributed and reviewed. A motion was made by Teresa, seconded by Jane, and carried to approve the minutes as presented.

<u>Treasurer's Report</u>: Jill presented and reviewed the financial reports for the period January through May 2024. A motion was made by Wanda, seconded by Mary Nell, and carried to approve the financial reports as presented.

Old Business:

■ The Chuck Crain (gospel singer from Branson, MO) concert will be held at Immanuel at 7:00 p.m. on Thursday, August 22, and is open to the public. • May 19 secretary minutes read and approved

- Treasurer's report: The total income from January to June was \$38,881.33; total expenses were \$41,270.94. As of June 30, 2024, we have \$22,121.46 in the general fund checking account. Report approved.
- Jill and Bonnie are on the parish budget committee. Jill shared the handout prepared for that meeting with estimates of what Gary can afford to pay into the parish for the church to stay viable.
- Current telephone service will drop long distance coverage as of September 30.
- Katie shared about the car gifted to Gary that she has been using for the parish. She shared blue book info and expressed interest in buying the car. Another person has also inquired about purchasing, if available. Motion made, seconded, approved to give Katie first chance for purchase at \$5900, the average price on Kelly's blue book information.
- Reminder of parish fundraiser at Immanuel on Thursday, August 22.
- Discussed possible fall worship times for feedback.
- September 29 is a fifth Sunday, with Gary hosting the parish service at 9 a.m. with food to follow by both Gary and Ness churches.
- Next council meeting is planned for September 8 following worship. Sunday School will start September 15.

Budget Financial Highlight as of June 30

As of June 30, Gary has received \$38,881, which is 54% of our anticipated \$72,000 income to make the budget. Income is from offering, fundraisers, parish reimbursement, Ness reimbursements, and some special one-time gifts. We are running a \$2,400 deficit. This amount would be higher if not for some special one-time gifts and \$2,500 return from the parish payment.

A total of \$2,465 was netted from Gary Days Meatball Supper and Snack Shack. Thanks to all who helped. This included a \$45 gift from the Bead & Tie girls. We are thankful for their generosity to our ministry.


