Contact the person directly but not by replying to the message you received and let them know as they may not know this is happening.

All together, we were able to share the message of "Who Is Your Neighbor" with around 45 young people. Crafts, games, songs, Bible stories and more all were used to let kids know that Jesus loves THEM and YOU! Offering was raised to support community needs to do with children. At Immanuel Lutheran, we raised \$68.85 to send to the Jamestown family who lost children in a car cash. At Gary Lutheran, we raised \$110 for the Lily Thronson fundraiser. At Our Savior's, we raised \$52 to donate to the Win-E-Mac Sole Tree, which purchases school shoes for students.

A huge THANKS goes out to all of our dedicated helpers, teachers, teen leaders, snack makers, staff, and to the adults who made it a priority to bring kiddos to VBS. VBS couldn't happen without you! Minutes - A New Journey Parish Council Meeting

(6:30 p.m. on August 12, 2024, at Immanuel Lutheran, Bejou, MN)

Council members present: Mary Nell Preisler, Becky Olson (for Jimmy Steinmetz), Kristi Skeie, Tanya Hamre, Teresa Werpy, Karen Carlsrud, and Jill Nelson. (Others attending:

Bonnie Werpy, Sue Gunderson, Katie DeMarais, Rachel Roggenbuck, and Pastor René. Duane Gunderson was present to report on the 2025 Budget Committee).

Teresa called the meeting to order and Pastor René led devotions.

<u>Secretary's Report</u>: Minutes of the July 15, 2024, meeting were distributed. A motion was made by Becky, seconded by Kristi, and carried to approve the minutes as presented. <u>Treasurer's Report</u>: Following Jill's distribution and review of the current financial reports, a motion was made by Mary, seconded by Tanya, and carried to approve the financial reports as presented.

Old Business:

- Duane Gunderson reported on the July 25 meeting of the Parish Budget Committee where two members of each congregation who best knew the congregations' financials met. They reviewed their financial statuses, brainstormed, and discussed ideas for the 2025 Budget and possibilities that could be implemented to continue beyond the three-year commitment. It was noted that there is information, such as 2025 staff compensation, needed by the Budget Committee prior to their next September meeting.
- The Chuck Crain concert and meal event was discussed, including meal plans, setup, and cleanup.

New Business:

- With Katie leaving the end of August, the following items were reviewed:
 - o An update of ministry coverage for the remaining year. December 24 services will be 4pm at Our Savior's and 8pm at Gary. December 25 services will be at Immanuel and Ness with times yet to be finalized.
 - Pastor René will lead Confirmation and is working on contacting students and setting up a schedule.
 - o An addendum to Rachel's SAM agreement was reviewed, which included adding 12 hours to her previous 13 hours per week.
 - Items yet to be addressed are: Youth Group, VBS, Family Playdates, Bible Camp, Third Grade Bibles, First Communion, and Senior Quilts
 - o Parish Council requested a list of Katie's job duties and who is taking over those duties.

Staff Reports:

Katie covered the following:

■ VBS update

Rachel covered the following:

- She has been working with Pastor René to discuss ongoing duties.
- She also has been handling some visitations and working on the Chuck Crain concert/meal event.

■ Bridget Roggenbuck is done helping with taping as of the end of August. Mike Roggenbuck (Rachel's husband) is taking over Bridget's duties and is donating his time. We will send Bridget a note thanking her for her service.

Pastor René covered the following:

- Continuing to hold onto the taping ministry survey results for further discussion.
- Shared work done in the last month in the key areas of Administration, Building a Sense of Community, Preaching/Worship (including leading worship/Bible Studies at area nursing homes), Youth & Families, and Caring Ministry.

No decision has yet been made on a date for Katie's "send-off" event.

A motion was made by Becky, seconded by Kristi, and carried, to set the ANJLP Council Meetings for the second Monday each month, at Immanuel at 6:30 p.m. The next ANJLP Council meeting will be held Monday, September 9, 2024, at 6:30 p.m. at Immanuel. A motion was made by Becky, seconded by Mary, and carried, to adjourn. The meeting closed with the Lord's Prayer.

- June minutes approved
- Financial Report as of end of July: net loss was \$5,423.89 with total year loss of \$26,611.68. Dave, Jane and Anita are set up as Thrivent account signers. Parsonage sale funds will be put in Thrivent for use in general fund.
- The parsonage committee will put the parsonage up for sale after September 1 for \$220,000, with advertising on Zillow and social media sites.
- Gordie will help Bruce Haaven measure and stake out more cemetery plots.
- Plans are to purchase 100 Hugo's fundraiser books for \$2 each and sell them for \$10 each.
- VBS will be held August 14.
- There will be no worship services on September 1 due to Labor Day weekend.
- Fall Meatball Dinner will be held September 22 following worship.
- Rachel gave an update on the Chuck Crain concert/meal and indicated Our Savior's is to bring desserts for the meal.
- We took in \$389 at the Parish worship service held June 30 at the Park. Backpacks were ordered and the remaining funds were given to the Sole Tree Shoe Program for kids at the Win-E-Mac School.
- With Katie leaving August 31, Rachel will increase her weekly hours through December 2024.
- Next council meeting will be held September 8 following worship.
