RESIGNATION ANNOUNCEMENT: It is with regret that the ANJLP parish council accepted Pastor Rene's resignation effective February 28, 2025. She will be the next ordained minister at First Congregational United Church of Christ in Menomonie, WI. Her last Sunday will be February 16, her last worship February 19, and her last work day February 20. *A Parish-wide Open House Send-Off at Immanuel will be Wednesday, February 19, at 5:30-7pm followed by worship at 7pm.*

PARISH TREASURER: We announced in the last newsletter that Jill Nelson was planning to conclude her service as Parish Treasurer as of December 31, 2024. We are happy to announce that she has had a change of heart and will continue those duties through the end of 2025.

SUNDAL LUTHERAN CHURCH ANNOUNCEMENT: Following the decision of A New Journey's parish council to stop providing contracted pulpit supply services to Sundal Lutheran Church at the end of 2024, Sundal Lutheran Church offered a call to Katie DeMarais. Katie will serve Sundal Lutheran Church as a very part-time SAM (Synod Authorized Minister), beginning January 1, 2025. This call is to provide worship leadership, pastoral care, and pastoral acts only to and with Sundal Lutheran Church and its members. Because of our long history of ministry together before and during A New Journey's formation, both in terms of Sundal and Katie, we will all work together to maintain boundaries while also sharing in ministry. This may include Sundal still purchasing services from Gary Lutheran and the parish (such as newsletter, bulletins, or office support). Because of the intricacies of membership and intermingled families, Katie will strive to work with A New Journey staff to decide what types of pastoral care/acts fall

within her call and which fall within the purview of A New Journey. As always, this is God's work, and we are God's hands, feet, and voices in this world together. NOTE: Sundal will have worship on February 16 at 10:30am.

Genelle's time and how she can steward that time most efficiently and effectively. There is an opportunity to talk to her in person on February 10th. She will be attending the next Parish Council meeting and would be open to questions you may have. Please feel free to come on the 10th. I have heard that there are some of you that have concerns. That is great. That means you are invested in the future, you want to know and hopefully you would want to be part of the next step.

We will be having an open house celebration for Pr. René on her final Worship Service with us on Wednesday, February 19th from 5-6:30pm before Wednesday Worship at Immanuel at 7pm. Please come celebrate all the great contributions Pr. René has shared in her time here.

In closing, I want you all to know that I believe we can be successful as a parish as we come together to share God's love with all we encounter. The mission we have become as part of this "A New Journey Lutheran Parish" is very important to me and I hope to all of you. Let's dig in and find a way to make this work!

Pastor René went on to read her letter of resignation effective February 28, 2025. She has accepted a call and will be the next ordained minister at First Congregational United Church of Christ in Menomonie, WI. Her last Sunday will be February 16, her last worship is February 19, and her last work day will be February 20. A motion was made by Mary, seconded by Marilyn, and carried to accept Pastor René's resignation with regret.

As a member of the Call Committee, Susie reported that the Synod has been notified and the email from the Synod was read. Their representative, Pastor Genelle Netland, Associate to the Bishop, will be at Immanuel on February 10 to do an exit interview with Pastor René and then meet with the Parish Council to guide us through October 31, 2025, which is the end of our Parish Agreement.

It was suggested that a parish open house send-off for Pastor René be held at Immanuel on Wednesday, February 19, from 5:30-7:00 p.m. followed by worship.

Pastor René indicated that before she leaves, she plans to complete Confirmation with the two 8th grade Confirmation students.

Discussion was held on ways to communicate Pastor René's departure with the members. Jimmy also noted that current plans are to pay rent for the "parsonage" through March 15, 2025, as the renter has given us some leeway on the one-year contract.

A motion was made by Mary, seconded by Teresa, and carried to adjourn. The meeting closed with the Lord's Prayer.

Old Business:

- Our Savior's reported that the Hugo's coupon book campaign is going well, also.

■ Jim mentioned Immanuel fundraisers were very successful again this year.

New Business:

- Sue read Katie's announcement about serving Sundal as a very part-time SAM.
- Pr. René is trying to end well, by finishing up all commitments with youth, confirmation, and release time, etc. She also noted that "good enough" may be all that is completed.
- Rachel has touched bases with 2 of the 3 nursing facilities that Pr. René served to possibly serve in that capacity. Also, we discussed her taking left over bulletins with for those visited or attending.
- Rachel is planning to put together community events. Possibilities are: Gary = getting together at Who's Place/Legion; McIntosh = maybe candle making project; Bejou = something at the Community Center/Lean To.
- Ladies' night this month is at Peachy's in Bejou. Still looking into considering new options for the 3rd month in sequence.

Other business:

Mary thanked Parish Secretary for sending the bulletin each week. It means a lot since they are bound to worshipping at home at this time.
