LENT BEGINS:

Cross Examinations is the theme for our Lenten worship services. The series will give focus to the cross of Christ and its meaning for our life. The service will be built around a "Readers' Theatre" as ancient and contemporary characters confront one another and seek to discover how their Christian faith impacts on the issues in their lives.

The topics to be covered will include:

- 1. **The Grace of God Revealed** how an instrument of torture became a symbol of God's mercy.
- 2. A Matter of Death and Life includes an interview with Pontius Pilate concerning the justice and outcome of Christ's crucifixion.
- 3. Is the Cross Necessary? Annas and Caiaphas, Peter and Mark, Cyprian of Cathage and a panel of modern experts deal with the Problem of Christian suffering.
- 4. **Enemies of the Cross** appear not only at the foot of the cross then, but also in a restaurant and office today, anxious to remove the Cross from view.
- 5. What is Missing in Christ's Sufferings? an extended interview with St. Paul concerning the meaning and the results of faithful cross bearing.
- 6. **The Marks of Christ** may still be evident in the lives of those who follow him today.

Plan now to make your own **Cross Examinations** at our Wednesday night Lenten services.

(Note: Sundal will have 4pm Lenten services March 5 & 19, April 2, and Maundy Thursday, April 17.


PULPIT SUPPLY:

FINAL MESSAGE FROM PASTOR RENÉ L. MEHLBERG...

Dear Beloved Children of God:

By the time you read this, I will be in Menomonie, WI, getting settled as I begin my new call on March 1, preaching March 2.

The last month has flown by especially with two large funerals, wrapping everything up, fighting a cold, and multiple opportunities to say "farewell." Thankyou for all the gifts and cards, potlucks and farewells. As much as I'd like to write each of you an individual note, I know that will not be possible. For all those I didn't get the opportunity to see one last time, I apologize and I ask for your forgiveness. I did my best, even if my best may not have seemed "good enough" to some.

We are once again at a crossroads, a beginning and ending or ending and beginning. I share a slightly adapted version of Kate Bowler's blessing, "for beginnings and endings" from her book, <u>The Lives We Actually Have</u>.

This life is made up of so many beginnings and so many endings. We start new jobs and leave old ones. We move to new cities and leave part of our heart behind with all the lives we've touched. We continue following God's call on our life, following the Holy Spirit's "what's next?" while others are wondering what will be, perhaps worrying how it will all work out. Minutes - A New Journey Parish Council Meeting

(6:30 p.m. on February 10, 2025, at Immanuel Lutheran, Bejou, MN)

Jim Steinmetz called the meeting to order at 6:30pm and Pr. René led devotions.

Pr. Genelle, Associate to the Bishop, introduced herself and led us in prayer with laying of hands on Pr. René as she departs work with our parish and then Pr. René left the meeting. Pr. Genelle went on to report on the exit interview held with Pr. René, Wanda Stordahl, Sue Steinmetz, Cheryl Hagy and Jill Nelson prior to this parish council meeting, including a description of the covenant and confirmation that Pr. René has been paid up to date.

Sue Steinmetz suggested that each congregation should decide what are our wants and needs as it relates to ongoing worship services. It was also suggested that discussions should be held in congregations as to their wishes as we near the end of our 3-year parish agreement.

Pr. Genelle was asked what the Synod can do for us and she indicated we have four options:

- Hire a Vice Pastor, who is an ordained area retired Pastor we can call on if we need help with funerals, visitations, etc. She may have a list of some who may be available.
- Pulpit Supply: She has a list available. Note: As of March 9, the Synod will have 8-9 written sermons available for our use.
- SAM: They have none available. This would be someone we raise up from within our parish area, or just outside of it.
- Interim Pastor: An ordained Pastor we can contract with for a temporary period of time. She has someone in mind that we may be able to contact. This appeared to be the favorite option.

Rachel provided a proposed Sunday worship schedule through May, and went on to assure everyone that she will do what she can to support us through this transition period. Pr. Genelle suggested that Rachel's job description should be updated to include any new duties she takes on and reflected in her salary.

Secretary's report was distributed. Mary made a motion to approve, seconded by Jane and carried. Treasurer's report was distributed and reviewed by Jill. Kristi made a motion to accept, second by Jane. Motion passed.
